Tips for Better Dressage Scores

(Synopsis of a Horse Illustrated article, October, '09, as compiled by Julie T.)

Dressage tests can be fun experiences if you have done your homework. Debbie Riehl-Rodriguez and Trena Atkins, both USEF dressage judges, offered the following thoughts and suggestions. Read their secrets to better scores!



Turnout

Show clothes and boots do not have to be fancy. Often, for training tests, dark or tan pants, white shirts, gloves, and helmets are just fine. But make sure they fit correctly and are clean. Wipe the dust off of your boots before you come into the arena and secure long hair in a hair net.

For horses, a braided mane isn't required but it helps show off the horse's neck and topline and demonstrates respect for the judge. These two judges say that if a horse comes into the arena not braided, they think the rider is lazy and didn't want to bother. This will affect the overall impressions. "Braiding doesn't have to be perfect - any attempt is appreciated."

Figures and Movements

Riders leave a lot of points on the table with their geometry. Judges will look at the basics of the movement first and the geometry second.

If the figure is good, the judge is going to go up a point; if it's poor she will go down a point. This is because if the horse does the pattern correctly, it creates an increased degree of difficulty. If the rider is cheating, for example, making a 20-meter circle instead of the required 15-meter circle, this decreases the difficulty of the movement.

Riders also often make the mistake of putting corners into rounded figures, such as the circles and serpentines. These judges say that a lot of times, when they want to give an 8 to a circle, they can't because the rider squared it off.

Correct geometry includes making transitions at the letters (or between them at the lower levels) which means when the rider, not the horse's nose, is at the letter.

Another difficult movement for many riders is the centerline. It should be straight and accurate so practice making the turn to hit the centerline correctly. When you are riding down to the halt at X, don't turn your head from side to side to see if you are in the center of the arena. It's a little red flag that tells the judge you don't know where X is. A judge sitting at C can't see if you are exactly at X or not - we can only tell if the rider has gone way past it, and if the rider is straight and fully halted.

Riding the Gaits

Riders often use the walk phases of the tests as a breather but they're actually important scores. When the horse walks his head and neck stretch forward and moves up and down. The rider needs to follow this movement with seat and hands to allow the horse to use his topline. Using too much seat in the walk, however, can be a negative factor in the horse using his back and shoulders. In the free walk in particular, the horse must be allowed freedom. Free walk means he uses his whole body to cover ground.

At the Introductory and Training Levels, the first and last halt may be done through the walk. Many riders just slam on the brakes, which causes the horse to fall on his forehead without being square. It would benefit many horses if the rider was to ride a step or two of walk into the halt at Training Level for better preparation and the balance and straightness that is needed at First Level halts.



Know the Rules

Making a riding mistake is one thing. But breaking a rule or making a faux pas because you're unenlightened is another. Riding a great test and getting eliminated or losing points because you failed to follow the rules is

embarrassing. So read your rulebook carefully each year to see what has changed.

These judges share 5 deal-breakers:

- The judge likes to blow the whistle on the exact time of your scheduled ride. You only have 45 seconds after the whistle to enter the arena. Being hurried and flustered is no way to start your test. And if you're late, you're eliminated.
- A lengthy whip can get you the boot. Know and use the correct dimensions.
- Many riders like to warm up with boots or bandages. You will be eliminated for entering the ring with them, so remember to have someone remove them for you. (not a problem for NPWHA/PWHA shows as once the show has begun, no boots are allowed, even in the warm up arenas....but if you compete at other venues, i.e., ETI, this is good to know)
- All tests from Training through Fourth Level may be called (read aloud by a reader).
- If the judge blows the whistle during your ride, be sure you know why. Go to the judge and find out what to do next. Many people keep riding when they hear the whistle or are unsure of what to do. It's perfectly acceptable to approach the judge to find out where you went wrong and where to pick back up.

Contact

The horse and rider must also demonstrate correct contact and acceptance of the bit for the level shown. The horse should never resist the contact, come up against the bit or drop behind the vertical.

One thing we see often, especially with junior riders, is a rider trying to get the horse on the bit by see-sawing the reins. The horse comes down the centerline and all we see is the horse's head wagging back and forth like a windshield wiper!

Some riders make the mistake of thinking it's their job to take contact with the horse, whereas it should be the horse taking contact by stretching into the rider's hand. This contact develops from the active use of the haunches over a swinging back (which should be free of tension) and stretching the entire topline toward the rider's hand, which lightly balances and directs the horse.

Many riders think their horses are resistant to the contact. In reality, either the reins are too short or there is too much tension on the reins from the rider.

The Rider's Score

Certain scores reflect the rider's ability to correctly influence the horse with an effective position. These judges feel this is a big issue because the rider affects every single score.

An obvious lack of basics will bring a rider's score down every time. Your seat is an important aspect of dressage basics and a judge will notice a poor seat before anything else. However, they also understand that a good seat is an ongoing process and takes time to develop.

A huge giveaway that you are struggling with your seat is when the stirrups slip toward the back of your foot, so work on keeping the stirrup under the ball of your foot.

The correct stirrup length is important to your seat and position. Many riders assume they need to have the very long leg of some of the top riders. This takes time to develop. Your stirrup needs to be short enough to support bend and flexibility in your hips, knees and ankles. A stirrup that is too long will extend these joints too much and won't allow you to absorb the horse's movement.

Always remember that the word dressage means "to train". And that is what you are demonstrating. To do that the best way possible, you must execute every movement correctly as written in the rulebook, and keep in mind the requirements of the test.

Package them together with good turnout and an error-free ride, and you'll be on your way to a great score.

Humane Approach Pays Off for Equestrian Champion

Naturally-trained Tennessee Walking Horse stands out in an industry with a history of soring cruelty.

On a hilly farm in central Pennsylvania, a 15-year-old girl and a two-year-old Tennessee Walking Horse formed what can only be described as a mystical bond. They spent hours riding through pasture and woods, and she trained him without using a saddle, crop or a bit in his mouth. The two learned to communicate with body language and intention, and over time, they developed a remarkably fluid grace together.



Today, that girl—Elissa Dauberman, now 26—and that horse—Craving Blue, now 13—have won 28 national equestrian championships. In September, they will represent the Tennessee Walking Horse at the world's most prestigious horse riding competition: the 2010 Alltech FEI World Equestrian Games. The games will attract 600,000 spectators, and the competition will be broadcast live on NBC.

What is remarkable about Dauberman and Blue is not only their high level of skill and achievement in the equine world, but also the example they are setting for more humane treatment of horses in general—and Tennessee Walking horses in particular.

Cruel Intentions

Tennessee Walking Horses are famous for their running walk, which is a four-beat gait that can reach speeds of up to 12mph, during which the rider sits absolutely still in the saddle without bouncing. But the sad truth is that the high-stepping stride exhibited in the top levels of Walking horse competition too often comes at a horrible cost.

The culprit is "soring," a cruel practice that involves intentionally inflicting pain to a horse's legs to enhance its gait. Commonly used techniques include applying caustic chemicals to the horse's ankles to cause irritation, or "pressure shoeing"—cutting the horse's hoof almost to the quick and tightly nailing on a shoe. Soring is illegal under federal law, but inspections reveal that this cruelty is still routinely practiced by some Tennessee Walking Horse owners and trainers.

In 2006, the annual Tennessee Walking Horse National Celebration in Shelbyville, Tenn. failed to name a World Grand Champion because most of the finalists were disqualified for violations of the federal Horse Protection Act. In 2009, a record number of violations were cited at the event.

"This deliberate infliction of pain upon these noble, stoic horses is animal cruelty—no less so than dogfighting or cockfighting," said Keith Dane, Director of Equine Protection at The Humane Society of the United States.

Understanding the Language

When she trained Blue in Pennsylvania, Dauberman had never heard about the cruelty that many other Walking Horses suffered. She simply followed her instincts.

"Blue was the first horse I trained from the beginning. He had never been ridden," Dauberman said. "We taught each other."

Dauberman followed the principles of natural horsemanship, which is based on the idea that the best way to work with horses is to use body language they can understand.

"A lot of people don't understand the language of the horse," Dauberman says. "It is definitely a deeper level of communication. When you understand the language, the horse is going to listen because it chooses to listen. It becomes a natural thing."

A Natural Talent

"What sets Blue apart from other Tennessee Walkers is he's 100 percent natural," she says. "His talent, athleticism and personality really shine."

Dauberman follows a natural care regime for Blue, using products from one of her sponsors, Zephyr's Garden.

"I do a lot of things that others don't do to keep him comfortable. He gets bi-weekly full body massages, daily supplements and magnetic therapy. He gets the spoiled horse treatment and he definitely deserves it."

"His care routine includes daily turnout into the pasture with his brothers. He is allowed to be a real horse, rather than being cooped up in a stall all day like most show horses. He is barefoot, which is virtually unheard of in the heavy-shod Walking Horse industry."

Changing the Industry Standard

Dauberman is active in the Alliance to End Soring, a group formed in 2008 to work with the USDA, Congress, and Tennessee Walking Horse industry stakeholders to advocate for increased enforcement of the Horse Protection Act and to raise public awareness of the pervasive use of soring. Founding Alliance members include The Humane Society of the United States, The American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals, the Animal Welfare Institute, the American Horse Defense Fund, Friends of Sound Horses and the Horse Protection Commission.

"The anti-soring initiative is getting a lot of notice," Dauberman said. "I think we're starting to change things."

In Pennsylvania, Dauberman is busy preparing for her worldwide performance at the World Equestrian Games.

"We do a bareback, bridle-less jumping routine in an open field," she says. "Everybody has their talents. I feel I was born to do this. A great horse can teach you everything you need to know about life. All you have to do is listen."
